We invite you to take part in X-History, Join human history: to tell the story of your journey and preserve what matters to you, your loved ones and future generations.

Behind your work are years of effort, important decisions, experience gained and people who stood beside you. Behind your achievements is the story of how it all began and what it took to keep going. These details reveal the person: their character, beliefs and contribution to the lives of others.

Preserve what matters

X-History helps bring a life together into a coherent biography, connecting memories, photographs, achievements, projects and family history. It lets readers discover the person behind the name, understand their decisions and learn how they created what matters to them.

A personal story within a larger history

Our long-term goal is to develop an international collection of personal stories. Individual lives reveal how professions evolved, businesses emerged, ideas took shape and knowledge was passed on. Every new biography adds experience that was not there before.

Your journey deserves to be told

The project welcomes people with something to pass on: entrepreneurs, professionals, inventors, educators, creators and keepers of family archives. You do not need to be famous. What matters is your experience, your work and what you want to preserve for others.

While you can tell it yourself

Only you can explain why you made an important decision, who supported you in a difficult moment and what you consider your greatest achievement. Tell it in your own words, as you want to be understood and remembered.

What your story offers you and others

A biography looks to the future, but it is useful today. It helps you introduce yourself, explain your experience and preserve what often remains scattered across photographs, documents and conversations.

For business and professional introductions

Share your page with a partner before a meeting, an event organiser or someone discovering your work for the first time. They can explore your journey, projects and achievements in one place. This provides context for a meaningful conversation and helps explain the experience behind your name.

For family and future generations

Preserve the names of people in photographs, the reasons behind moves, family connections and important turning points. Children and grandchildren can discover more than dates: they can learn what their loved one believed, what helped them act and what they learned along the way.

For reflection on your own journey

Bringing your story together lets you revisit decisions, see connections between events and decide what to share. You choose the information to publish and approve the text. Your biography can be prepared in Russian or English, or in both languages if needed.

One page, many reasons to share

Before an important meeting, share one link instead of a collection of scattered materials. For your family, preserve a story they can return to. For colleagues and students, explain how you arrived at your decisions. One biography helps different readers discover what truly matters to you.

What stands behind your name

A job title and a short profile rarely explain how someone came to their work. A biography makes room for first attempts, mentors, turning points and principles. These details help readers understand your journey and ask the questions that begin a meaningful introduction.

Start with what you already have

You do not need to write a book yourself or prepare a perfect archive in advance. A personal account, a few photographs and links to your projects can be the starting point. We help build a coherent story from your materials and memories.

Meetings, shared experience and new connections

Our development programme includes themed meetings, editorial stories about projects and introductions by mutual consent. Future directions include special offers from partners and joint cultural and educational initiatives. The club programme is still in development; its specific benefits and terms will be announced separately.

From materials to a coherent account

Together, we identify the key stages, events and people. Photographs gain captions and context; projects gain explanations of their purpose and results; memories find their place in the wider account. Visitors can then better understand how individual events form your journey.

You review the story before publication

You read the completed text and make corrections. The scope, timing and terms are agreed in advance. The example on the next page shows how a biography, projects and family history can come together in one place.

You define the boundaries of your story

You do not need to publish everything. You may focus on your professional journey, family memories or combine several areas. You choose the information for your public page; private material you do not wish to share need not be included.

Discover how your story could look

On the website, you can explore a completed biography and see how its projects, life events and family connections are presented. This can help you decide which materials you would like to include on your own page.

Tell us about yourself

Start with a short message: what you do, which journey you want to share and what matters to preserve. You can include links to your projects or describe the materials you have collected. We will discuss how to bring them together into your story.

What to include in your first message

Name a few important stages in your life or work. Tell us whom the biography is for: family, professional contacts or a wider audience. Mention the photographs, memories and publications you have. You do not need a complete set of materials immediately; simply indicate where we can begin.
